Planning for Post-Secondary Grade 12 Checklist

May

- ◇ Most offers of admission are made in May. Hopefully you should hear back soon from a post-secondary school!
- ◇ When you hear back from a post-secondary school, remember to put your Student ID Number and PAC (Personal Access Code) in the special folder you created. You will use these quite often in the future.
- ◇ As soon as you have decided which offer to accept, notify the post-secondary school of your decision.
- ◇ If you are placed on a post-secondary school's waiting list and intend to enroll if accepted, call or write the Admissions Office to ask how to strengthen your application or to find out your standing.
- ◇ If you're considering student funding, ask your high school guidance counsellor for a student loan application form and begin filling it out. If you prefer, you can also apply online.

TIP: It's a good idea to submit a student loan application by May 31.

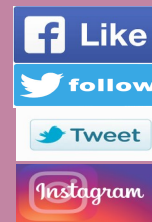

Spring 2022 – Exploratory Programming

Agriculture

- May 18

In this session, students are invited explore the vast world of agriculture, taking a glimpse at everything from soil and greenhouse subjects to commodity marketing and beyond.

Architecture and Design

- May 3, May 10

In this session, students will build the home of the future, while learning what it takes to be an architect in today's industry. After exploring historical and futuristic home designs, with a focus on sustainability, participants will have the opportunity to build and animate a digital model of their dream home.

Carpentry

- May 4

Students will be introduced to the safety and use of portable power tools and stationary power tools. In this hands-on session, they will create a small wood bench/stool, which they can then take home. This day-long project will have students work on measuring and laying out their projects and cutting the pieces required to build it, before assembling. **Please note, project is subject to change.*

Criminal Justice

- May 11, May 25

In this realistic session, students will split into groups and experience mock traffic investigations and courtroom proceeding. Learning some basic theory from experienced investigators, participants will enjoy taking a hands-on look at speed enforcement equipment, such as radar guns. In the courtroom, students will also gain valuable experience as they navigate courtroom rules and procedures, observe a trial and practice counsel.

Engineering

- May 3, May 4

Breaking into smaller groups to allow for rotation, there are many different areas and activities to explore in this session. From surveying a field using state-of-the-art survey equipment in teams and creating maps from the data to using computer software to design buildings and building systems and 3-D printing, the day will have many opportunities to engage with technology. For those in favour of hands-on activities, there will also be soil experiments and materials labs.

Environmental Sciences

- May 3, May 10

Potential environmental scientists will enjoy the realistic and extremely hands-on session planned for them, as they investigate an unknown environmental phenomenon in the coulees using field, research and lab skills. Participants will get a front row seat to the action as they attempt to answer complex questions about the environment.

Healthcare

- April 26, May 4, May 17, May 24

Students attending this session will enjoy hands-on experience exploring a number of different health careers. Highlighted programs will include Therapeutic Recreation Gerontology, Massage Therapy, Nursing, Health Care Aide and Unit Clerk, with a focus on the many aspects of care that impact a patient. From massage techniques and vital signs, to mechanical lifts and syringe injections, participants will get a realistic look inside the healthcare industry.

Media

- April 28, May 18

Exploring four main areas of media, this session provides the opportunity to create content with industry-level equipment and software. From hosting an entertainment show on a television set and capturing portraits in the photography studio to producing a radio commercial and using graphic design to bring your creativity to life, there's something for every student.

Natural Resource Compliance

- May 4, May 11

Students participate in the great outdoors for the first half of this session as they investigate a wildlife crime scene, covering everything from conducting interviews and taking notes, to creating sketches and applying field investigation techniques. Once complete, they'll move into the lab spaces for closer look at content, including subjects such as forensic materials.

Virtual Reality

- May 4, May 11, May 18

Students will gain hands-on experience with XR development in fun, fast-paced activities. From playing VR games to learning different areas of development through instructor-led tutorials, the session will be filled with unique learning opportunities. The final part of the day will see participants plan and build a short VR experience to share with others.

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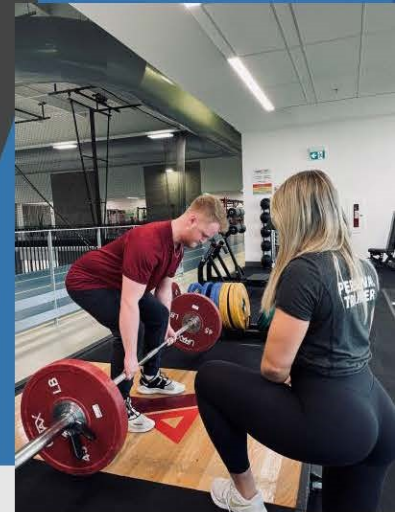
